

## News from the Team



### WCC

All members of the team have been involved in the in-house discussions on new working styles and on the directions the Harare Assembly has given for our work. We are learning how to work together within our new teams and across teams. Both for teams which have a nucleus of staff who are used to working together and for those, like the EEF team, which are a new creation, this is a time of change.

### ETE

We are in the process of appointing a short term Consultant for Orthodox Theological Education to work with ETE. Their task will be to make links with theological educators in the Orthodox Church to help them meet their needs and to encourage ecumenical theological education in their formation processes. This work will feed into a Consultation which will make longer term plans.

As part of a process of regionalising ETE's work, representatives of the Latin America and Caribbean network will meet in Costa Rica in April to consider the possibility of an appointment part-time working in a theological insti-

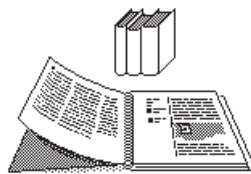
tution and part-time supporting the regional network.

## Scholarships/ Human Resource Development

The WCC Scholarships Committee meets in April. It meets twice a year and part of each meeting is spent on allocating scholarships. The Committee tries to maintain a global balance according to need. Scholarships are given with the purpose of benefitting the work of the nominating church or related organisation and not just the individual concerned.

Only applications made through the National Correspondent of each country are considered. Writing directly to the WCC wastes the applicant's time and postage.

The book outlines some of the significant elements in education processes undertaken by women. The use of symbols and images, storytelling and the critical issues concerning its use as a method, dealing with subjectivities, healing and spirituality.
